The American Society of Nepalese Engineer (ASNEng) celebrated its 10th Anniversary at its Annual Conference and General Membership Meeting held at Manassas, Virginia, U.S.A. on June 24 - 25, 2017. The Conference was attended by approximately 150 participants, including practicing engineers, scientists, technologists, academicians, students, industry leaders, and their guests. With the theme “Innovation in Engineering and Scientific Knowledge for Tomorrow”, the conference featured an opening program with 4 distinguished guest speakers, a keynote lecture, one plenary technical session with 3 distinguished speakers, and three more technical sessions, including one poster and two oral presentation sessions. Altogether 20 technical presentations were delivered at this year’s conference.

Arizona State University (ASU) and Institute of Engineering (IOE) joint collaboration on Environmental Science-Sustainability Study Abroad Program

The 2014 Joint ASNEngr/CAN-USA Conference at Tempe, AZ provided a platform for the leaders of ASU and IOE to interact with each other. In 2015, a MoU was signed between ASU and IOE to increase the mutual collaboration. It was a remarkable achievement on initiating and creating a platform for two institutions to work together facilitated by ASNEngr.

In order to foster the ties between the two institutions, Dr. Nalini Chhetri (ASU - Assistant Director, Consortium for Science, Policy, and Outcomes) led a study abroad program to Nepal in May 2016. The program involved 14 ASU students, 1 ASU observer and 1 health staff along with 1 faculty and 6 students from TU. As a part of the program, the attendees visited the US Embassy in Nepal, Patan Museum, Dulikhel, Sindhupalchowk, Chitwan, Pokhara, Lumle Agricultural Research center. Some of the program highlights are:

- ASU students learned about the environment, food source, climate, and market in Nepal leading to numerous discussions and brainstorming.
- "Our first stop this week was up into the mountains to stay at a small permaculture farm. There we learned about the benefits of small scale permaculture farms and the positive impacts that come from integrating crop growth. Everything on the farm has a purpose and waste is always reused and recycled." said Madeline Mahnick, an ASU sustainability student. She also added "Staying in the buffer zones made our team face complex sustainability questions. Nepal is a small country with a large population. It's hard to create conservation areas because there isn't much room to have a space dedicated to just wildlife. Where do you put the people? We brought up important questions about how to treat animals fairly while creating a sustainable space for humans to live."

These were important questions that can't be answered overnight! However, it was an exciting experience to get our feet wet and begin to learn about the buffer zones and wildlife conservation.

- ASU students and TU students also had a good discussion on the best sustainability practices, risk and resiliency issues in different areas including urban, rural and buffer zones.
- 12 Nepalese participants ranged from geologist to air quality, urban system, and biodiversity experts.
- ASU students also get to enjoy the home-stay experience in Chitwan and Pokhara.
- ASU students amazed with the presentations on reduction on Rhino poaching and slowly revival of wild life in Nepal, majestic mountains and terrains of a developing nation.

- ASU students raised few hundred dollars and donated soccer ball, badminton and other sport supplies to students of a school in Sindhupalchowk. They also donated Nrs 22,000 to the school.
- Dr. Chhetri suggested she planned to have similar Study Abroad Program in Nepal next year. Please contact ASNEng or Dr. Chhetri for more details.
